Why?

- Health care is essential in this remote area even with the advanced technology and transportation.





Why would you move out of Cook County? (295 responses)

- The cost of living is so high here, wages quite low, and education appears to be suffering. There are more opportunities for young families and children in other places.
- As a professional with two full time employed adults we are barely making ends meet, even with very conservative spending habits.
- Very expensive. I have a pretty good job for our community and still cannot afford anything above and beyond the basic essentials.
- It's taken a lot of effort to stay here over the past years, and despite its hardships and shortcomings, there is no better place to live.

- I've seen many people my age (34) come and go because of lack of jobs, housing, or communications infrastructure.
- I would move because it seems to me that the tourists are the ones that are listened to. And it also seems that we have more and more people moving here from the cities that are taking control of this community. I grew up here and I can tell you that it isn't the way it used to be.


growth implications

If very concerned about growth, why? (148 responses)

- Growth is needed to sustain a healthy environment for all.
- We have passed the population level which the environment will support without degradation.
- Our retirement population is growing but we are drastically losing families with kids. We need the families to keep the community healthy
- I feel that the local economy is not producing enough quality career opportunities for young people in their 20s and 30s.
- Mostly concerned about the lack of growth in families and children and the effect that has on the school system and community overall. I value the vibrancy that diversity brings

- I feel that the older citizens who I think make up the majority of new residents do not understand what it takes for young people and families to continue to live here.
- It is important to continue to grow, however it must be done in the right manner....sustainable, respect for the natural environment.
- I think the remoteness of the county, the price of living, and the limited variety of jobs will keep our growth stagnant no matter what. As long as we live within our means, that is okay.




Concern about the Impact of Development on Aesthetics (154 responses)


- If we don't conserve our natural beauty, we will never get it back.

- We should not change the reasons why people come here to visit and live. We should not look like every other community.


- Need to have balance.

Positives:


- Higher education is great and continuing to improve

Negatives:


- Education system is broken...state and nationally
